Mr. Mullis' Letter

December 3, 2025

As we begin the season of Advent, we enter one of the most meaningful and hope-filled times of the year for the Catholic Church. Advent is a sacred period of anticipation, preparation, and reflection, a time when the Church invites us to pause and prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ.

In a world that often moves too quickly, Advent reminds us to slow down and pay attention to God's presence in our lives. The candles of the Advent wreath, lit one by one each week, symbolize the increasing light of Christ overcoming the darkness in our lives. This growing light is more than tradition; it is a reminder that Christ comes to us continually, with hope, with healing, and with peace.

Advent also calls us to prepare spiritually. Just as we prepare our homes for Christmas, we are asked to prepare our hearts through prayer, reconciliation, acts of kindness, and a renewed commitment to faith. It is a season that encourages us to focus not only on the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, but also on welcoming Him into our homes, our relationships, and our daily.

For our children, Advent is especially important. They learn that Christmas is not just a day of gifts and , but a season rooted in faith, patience, and joyful anticipation. When families pray together, light the Advent wreath, attend Mass, or practice small acts of charity, children see firsthand what it means to prepare for Christ with intention and love. As a faith community, let us embrace this season with open hearts. May Advent be for each of us, a time of renewal, quiet hope, and deeper connection with God and one another and as we prepare for the coming of Christ, may we discover again the profound peace and joy that only He can bring.


