### Mr. Mullis' Letter

As we enter the season of Lent, we are reminded that these 40 days are a gift. They are an opportunity for each of us to slow down, reflect, and grow closer to God. Lent is an important season in the life of the Catholic Church, calling us to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as we prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter.

For our students, Lent is more than just a date on the calendar. It is an opportunity for real spiritual growth. It is a time for them to reflect on their actions, to practice self-discipline, and to make intentional choices that help them become the person God created them to be. 

Scout Sunday is celebrated in churches across America in February. It is a time when we come together as a Cub Scout Pack and Boy Scout Troop to thank you, the school and parish, for all the support you give us all year long. Between the Cub Scouts and the Boy Scouts, we have upwards of 60 scouts who participate in the program here at Holy Rosary. There is no way we could accomplish all that we do without your generous support and encouragement. If you have ever bought a car wash ticket, Christmas wreath, or a coke float, said a kind word to a scout, or offered him encouragement, you have supported scouting.


Scouting provides a safe-haven for school-aged youth. Scouting is a structured activity that offers fun and excitement while building confidence, character, leadership, and good moral values. The troop and pack always welcome new members to join us or just come to a meeting and ask questions. We are meeting in person (and virtually), participating in different events, and camping. Below are some highlights of each program:

**Boy Scouts** are ages 11-17. Troop 274 is very active in the Holy Rosary and Scouting communities. Our troop does several activities including camping, spelunking, backpacking, biking, water & snow skiing, hiking, canoeing, rock climbing, and more! We have a Venture Patrol for older scouts and have been backpacking in Philmont Scout Ranch in Cimarron, NM, scuba diving and deep-sea fishing at Sea Base in the Florida Keys, canoeing on the Boundary Waters in Ely, MN, hiking in Yellowstone & Glacier National Park, and much more. The national average for scouts who earn the Eagle Rank is 2%. During the past 10 years, Troop 274 has had 70% of its scouts earn the Rank of Eagle. Troop 274 meets every Monday night from 7:00 – 8:30 pm in the Scout Room on the west side of the Wiley gym. 


