October 23, 2024

Our teachers are looking forward to meeting with each of you next Friday, Nov. 1, for Parent/Teacher conferences. We want every parent to have the opportunity to hear how their child is doing no matter if they are doing well in all their subjects, or have some struggles. We feel it is important for all of our families to have a chance to ask questions, share concerns and hear from their child's teacher about the progress your student is making in all areas of school; academically, socially, and behaviorally. Your child's teacher will be in touch with you about scheduling your time to visit. I look forward to seeing you next Friday!

In today's newsletter, I have provided you with some tips to help ensure a positive conference. Please take a few minutes to read over these tips so that we can best serve your child and agree on the better path forward. Preparing ahead of time for your conference allows you to come in with a list of questions or topics to discuss so that you get all of your concerns addressed. It also allows you to make the best use of your allotted time and keeps the meeting on track. The teachers will also have their topics to discuss and will be ready to answer your questions.

We are getting close to our change to winter uniforms. After Daylight Savings Time, all students will need to follow our winter uniform policy. The biggest changes are:

- All students must wear their PE sweatshirts and sweatpants over the PE shorts and shirt on PE days.
- Prek-5th grade need to wear long pants instead of shorts.
- Junior High girls need to wear one of the following over their uniform blouse; PE sweatshirt, HR sweater vest, the HRS light blue sweatshirt, the navy quarter zip pullover, or a cardigan sweater.
- Girls may wear tights under their jumper/skirt but they should be black or navy blue.

If you have any questions about the uniform changes, please call the school office. There will also be a Used Uniform Sale on Wednesday, Oct. 30, in case you need to replace some items you are missing.

Parent/Teacher Conference Tips for Parents

Before the conference

Talk with your child

Ask your child what his/her strongest and weakest subjects are, and which subjects he/she likes most and least. Ask your child if he/she would like you to speak about anything in particular with the teacher. Make sure that your child understands that you and the teacher are meeting to help him/her, so that he/she doesn't worry about the conference.

• Prepare a list of notes

Make a list of topics that you want to discuss with the teacher and that you think the teacher should know, such as your concerns about the school issues, the child's home life, any major changes in your family, habits, hobbies, or anything that is worrying your child. Be sure to ask for input from your spouse or other adults that are caring for your child as well.

Prepare a list of questions

Preparing a list of questions will help you have a productive conversation with your child's teacher. Prioritize the questions in case you run out of time during the conference. The following questions are examples that will help you learn more about your child's progress in school:

- 1. What are my child's strongest and weakest subjects?
- 2. What are some examples of their strengths and weaknesses?
- 3. Does my child hand homework in on time?
- 4. How are my child's test-taking skills?
- 5. Is my child participating in class discussions and activities?
- 6. How are my child's social skills?
- 7. Does my child seem happy at school?
- 8. Have you noticed any unusual behaviors?
- 9. Do you think my child is reaching his/her potential?
- 10. What can I do at home to help support his/her academic progress?
- If your child receives special services (gifted programs, special education, speech or occupational therapy, or support for a learning disability), ask about the frequency of these services and about your child's progress with them.

During the conference

• Be on time

Get off to the right start: come to the conference on time. Remember that other parents may also have conferences scheduled for that day; if you arrive late, you have may missed your conference altogether. You should also plan on ending the conference at the scheduled time so that other parents can start their conference on time.

· Be yourself

Relax and be yourself. Remember that you and the teacher both the want the same thing: the very best for your child.

• Stay calm

Stay calm during the conference. Respectful communication will be the most effective way to work together with your child's teacher. Getting angry or upset during the conference will make it very difficult to have a positive conversation.

Ask for explanations of anything you don't understand

Listen carefully to what the teacher says. If you don't understand something that the teacher talks about (such as an educational term or an explanation of a school policy), don't be afraid to ask for clarification. It is important for you to understand what your child's teacher is telling you.

Ask the most important questions early in the conference

Ask the most important questions first as you may run out of time, especially if other parents are waiting to have their conference after yours. You can always schedule another meeting with the teacher to cover any points you didn't cover.

Respectfully discuss differences of opinion

If you disagree with the teacher, respectfully explain why you disagree. If you don't let the teacher know about your differences of opinion, the teacher may think that you agree and will move on to the next topic. Discussing your differences with the teacher may help both of you find a more effective way to help your child.

Create an action plan

Ask your child's teacher for specific suggestions of ways that you can help your child at home with homework, reading, organization, routines, behavioral issues, etc. Make sure you understand the teacher's suggestions, and ask for clarification if you don't. This list of suggestions will become the action plan. Establish a way to keep track of the child's progress, as well as the best way to stay in touch with your child's teacher — through phone calls, emails, notes, or meetings. Review the action plan with the teacher as you end the conference to make sure that you both have the same expectations.

Thank the teacher for meeting with you

Thank the teacher for her time and support of your child, as well as for anything specific that she has done to help your child.

After the conference

• Talk with your child

Talk about the conference with your child. Emphasize the positive points, and be direct about problems that were discussed. If you and the teacher created an action plan, explain it to your child. Make sure that your child understands that you and the teacher created this plan to help him.

Start working on the action plan

Set the action plan in motion. To ensure that it is working, check your child's behavior and schoolwork on a regular basis. Ask your child how he feels about school and his schoolwork.

Keep in touch with the teacher

Stay in touch with your child's teachers. This will help you strengthen the parent-teacher partnership, and will be an important part of the child's success in school. When a child sees that parents and teachers are working together, the child will understand that his/her education is a top priority at school and at home.



Pick-up:

- When you arrive to pick up your child each day we ask that you call the Aftercare number and let the staff know you are here. They will instruct you as to where they will meet you with your child.
- The Aftercare number is 901-724-5781. Please put this number in your phone.
- If you get to school and do not have the number it is posted on the main door and the red awning door for your convenience.
- Parents are responsible to clock their child out each day. The Aftercare staff will have an iPad for you to clock out with.
- You will need your personal FACTS ID number to clock out. If you do not know your ID number you can find it in your Family Portal account on the Family page. Also, the Aftercare staff can help you with your number if needed.
- Any child that is not clocked out will be given a clock out time of 6:00pm. Please be sure to clock your child out before you leave.
- If someone other than you will be picking up your child please notify the school beforehand. You may email your teacher or Ms. Bryan, call the school office, or call Ms. Bryan on the aftercare phone once Aftercare has started. Let them know the name of the person who is picking up and be sure to give that person your ID number to clock out your child(ren).


