Mr. Mullis' Letter

September 24, 2025

It seems like now is a very important time to make sure our children learn how to handle disagreements. Disagreements are a natural part of life for children (and adults). Whether it's arguing over whose turn it is to play a game, how to share toys, or differences in opinions, conflicts are inevitable when children interact. How they handle these disagreements can shape their relationships, emotional development, and social skills. Teaching children healthy ways to navigate peer conflicts is one of the most valuable lessons they can learn. Our counselors and teachers work with our students on this throughout the year. Here's how children can approach disagreements with mature and calm responses.

Stay Calm and Take a Deep Breath: When emotions run high, it's easy to say things we don't mean. Encouraging children to pause and take a few deep breaths when they're upset helps them regulate their emotions before responding. This simple step can prevent a small disagreement from turning into a major argument. As parents and teachers, we should practice calming techniques with children regularly, such as counting to ten, squeezing a stress ball, or using simple relaxing exercises.

Use "I" Statements Instead of Blame: Children often start sentences with "You always..." or "You never..." during conflicts. These statements can sound accusatory and escalate the situation. Teaching them to express how they feel using "I" statements can help reduce defensiveness. For example, instead of "You never let me play!" try "I feel left out when I don't get a turn." This approach fosters communication but it's not aggressive.

Listen to Understand, Not Just to Respond: Children sometimes listen just long enough to form a comeback. Encouraging them to truly hear what the other person is saying builds empathy and respect for differing perspectives. You can practice "active listening" by role-playing where one child speaks and the other must repeat what they heard before responding.

Find Common Ground and Compromise: Conflict resolution isn't about winning, it's about finding a solution that works for everyone. Children should be helped to identify what each person wants and then brainstorm ways to meet in the middle. For example, if two kids want to play with the same toy, they could take turns or choose a different activity they both enjoy.

Know When to Walk Away: Not every disagreement can be solved right away. Sometimes the best choice is to take a break and discuss it later with a clearer mind. Children should be taught that it's okay to walk away from someone who is being unkind or isn't being respectful.

Get Help from a Trusted Adult When Needed: Children shouldn't be expected to solve every conflict alone. If a disagreement turns into bullying, involves physical aggression, or makes them feel unsafe, they should know it's okay, and important, to ask for help. As adults we need to be a safe space. We need to listen without immediately jumping in to "fix" things unless necessary. Sometimes, asking "guiding" questions can help children reach their own solutions.

Reflect After the Conflict: After the situation is resolved, it's helpful for children to reflect on what happened and what they could do differently next time. This helps build self-awareness and emotional intelligence over time. Reflection questions might include; "What made me feel upset?", "How did I handle the situation?", and "What could I do better next time?"

Disagreements don't have to be negative experiences. When handled constructively, they can teach children valuable skills; like communication, empathy, patience, and problem-solving, which students can use throughout their life. Adults play an important role by modeling healthy conflict resolution, guiding children through tough situations, and creating environments where respectful dialogue is the norm. With the right tools, children can learn to navigate disagreements not with fear or frustration, but with confidence and care.

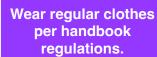

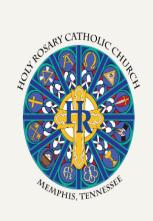

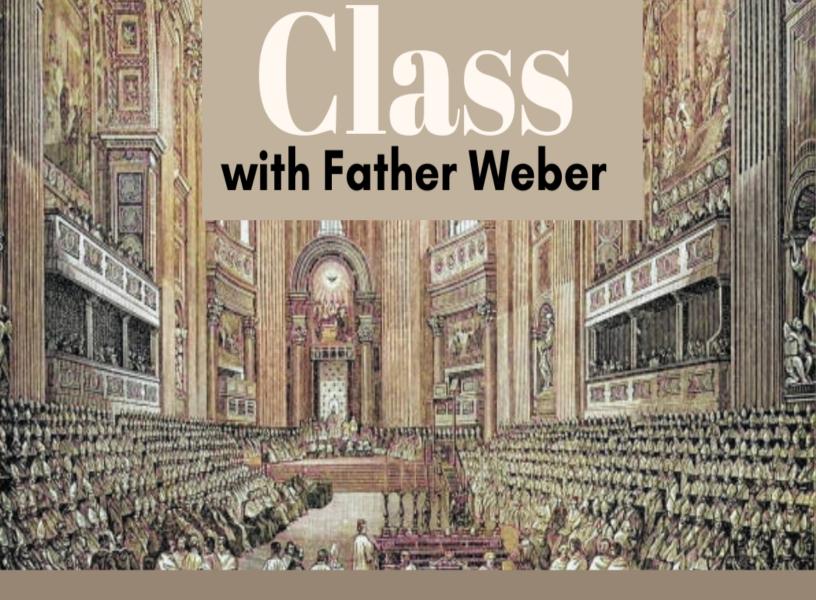
